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Dr Evelyne Micollier is a senior research scholar at IRD (French National Research Institute for Sustainable Development) working within the Research Center (CESSMA-Center for Social Sciences Studies in Africa, the Americas, and Asia), IRD-University of Paris Diderot-INALCO (French National Institute for Oriental Languages and Civilizations), and an associate research scholar at IrASIA (Research Institute for Asian Studies), representative member for China, CNRS (French National Center for Scientific Research)-Aix-Marseilles University.

She specialized in Social Anthropology, in East Asian (Chinese studies) and Southeast Asian Studies, and in Social Sciences of Health. She conducted anthropological field studies mainly in East Asia (P.R.China, Taiwan) and in a comparative perspective in Southeast Asia (Greater Mekong Sub-Region GMS, recently in Lao PDR, casually in Vietnam, Thailand). E.Micollier draws on comparative perspectives on health, social and gender issues; the anthropology of science/knowledge (including the anthropology of the body and the anthropology of pharmaceuticals) is a key field in her long-term research; in regard to the conceptual and methodological framework, she works at the interface of social anthropology, Asian studies (with a focus on Chinese studies), gender studies and social sciences of health.

She developed a strong expertise in 1) Gender&sexuality, corporal practice (qigong 气功 practices, *qi* cultivation) and health, 2) Research ethics, (bio)ethics, ethno-ethics and governance issues, and 3) production, co-construction, and dissemination of knowledge with a focus on therapeutic knowledge (case-studies: integrative medicine; Chinese medicine; pharmaceutical innovation, local/lay/scientific knowledge, local epistemologies) in times of globalization. She is the author of a number of publications on these fields and themes.

In a long-term research project in China, Beijing (2006-2011), Dr Micollier was the scientific manager of an international program in social sciences focusing on key cultural and social aspects of chronic/epidemic/STI (HIV and AIDS) such as gendered vulnerability, local governance&social organizations patterns confronted with global patterns and regulations; medical research and R&D (pharmaceuticals), research ethics and production/uses of scientific/local scholarly and lay knowledge. Her academic partners were the PUMC/CAMS (Peking Union Medical College/Chinese Academy of Medical

Sciences) 协和医科大学&中国医科学院, Department of Public Health and Department of Humanities&Social Sciences, Center for Bioethics, Qinghua University 清华大学, and the Beijing Peoples' University of China 北京人民大学, Department of Sociology.

She was an investigator in a Canadian-Chinese research project 'Living in Transnational Spaces' about Chinese (im)migrants in Canada living 'in-between' Canada and China (2011-2015), aimed at exploring the intersections of transnationalism, sexualities, intimate relations and health risks.

She worked as an investigator in a French ANR project on public policies, vectors' infectious disease (malaria) and health-related social inequalities in the Mekong Region (Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia), SOREMA (Societies, Résistances, Malaria: AMR Anti-microbial resistances) conducted in partnership with Pasteur Institute in Cambodia (2012-2015).

While stationed in Vientiane (2013-2017), she was the (co)-scientific manager a project in Southeast Asia about mother and child health and the prevention of HIV transmission in Lao PDR (*ANRS 12271*) including lines on body&selfhood perceptions and conceptions, uses and circulations of medicines, gendered social vulnerability, health-related ethical and governance issues. She engaged also on justice environmental and local land use issues: she focused on local/international ethics in relation with environmental justice (case-study of forest resource management in Northern Lao PDR).
